Its history dates back to pre-Roman times, when the settlement of Chellah was established at the mouth of the Bouregreg river in the third century BC. The fortress there and its sister fortress the Kasbah of the Oudayas are fantastic reminders of Rabat's grand past.

Rabat became Morocco's capital in 1912 and since then it has continued to prosper into the modern, dynamic city it is today with almost two million inhabitants. Rabat is a 21st century city, with all the conveniences and entertainment you can expect. Rabat is truly the ideal place for a foreigner to study in Morocco. There is much to explore within the city and also a lot of natural beauty to be found.

Courses

Group Courses, Modern Standard Arabic

Modern Standard Arabic (MSA) is the written language of Arabic. It is developed from Classical Arabic which is the language of the Holy Koran. MSA is the language of newspapers and the media. It is a living language used predominantly by educated people and intellectuals.

Group Courses, Moroccan Colloquial Arabic

Moroccan Colloquial Arabic (CA), also known as 'darija', is the spoken dialect of Morocco. Colloquial Arabic is grammatically simpler and has a less voluminous vocabulary than Modern Standard Arabic (MSA). While most words in Colloquial Arabic find their root in MSA, many colloquial words are borrowed from Spanish, French, and Berber.

Individual Courses

Taking an individual course gives you excellent opportunities to steer the pace and content of your lessons. The tutors are very good in adapting lessons to meet the needs of their students. One-to-one tuition guarantees fast progress and focuses on developing those language skills, which are important to you. We also offer more specialized courses designed for those who seek special language skills. Individual courses are normally not offered in the summer.

Accommodation
